These first two months have been an exciting transition period for the city. I have been diligently preparing for my first budget season as mayor while also making progress on various city projects.

Greenfield Recieves \$199,064 MOD Grant

Greenfield was awarded a \$199,064 grant from the Massachusetts Office on Disability (MOD) to address priority sidewalk and ADA curb ramp improvements. The funds will replace sidewalks along Beacon Street, as well as the installation of detectable warning plates at two intersections, Beacon Street at North Street and Beacon Street at High Street.

Updates to Meeting Access

We are happy to announce that the Planning Board, Zoning Board of Appeals, Board of Assessors and Board of Health will move to a hybrid/recorded model. Other boards and commissions, such as the Conservation Commission, will also now be recorded. We will continue working to improve access to local government.

Todd Dodge Named Acting Police Chief

Mayor Desorgher assigned Todd Dodge to assume the responsibilities as acting police chief, effective Wednesday, February 21, following Police Chief Robert Haigh's retirement.



"We have work to do, that is clear," said Dodge in the announcement. "I am eager to get started on rebuilding the relationship the Greenfield Police Department has with the City of Greenfield. We want everyone in the community to trust in us."
